You've been accepted to the University of Maine and we are thrilled that soon you will join the Black Bear community! Here is what you need to do next:

Confirm your Enrollment

Complete and return the enclosed confirmation form, including your enrollment deposit of \$150, to reserve your place in the upcoming class. Please include your name and the last four digits of your social security number on the form of payment. Your deposit will be credited to your account in the University Bursar's Office. Your confirmation deposit is key to receiving new student information and course registration materials.

For Spring 2010 enrollment, your confirmation is due by January 1, 2010, or within two weeks, if you are accepted after January 1. Enrollment deposits may be refunded upon written request through January 1, 2010.

For Fall 2010 enrollment, your confirmation is due by May 1, 2010, or within two weeks, if you are accepted after May 1. Enrollment deposits may be refunded upon written request through May 1, 2010.

If your plans change after the refund date, please notify us so we may withdraw you from any classes you may be enrolled in and campus housing.

Activate Your E-mail and MaineStreet Portal

All students accepted to UMaine are expected to regularly check their maine.edu email account and use the MaineStreet Portal to receive important information about financial aid, campus housing, registration, billing and student services, to check on their application and to update personal information. If you did not activate your UMS accounts when you applied, you must activate them now, following the instructions that were included in your acceptance letter. Questions? Apply for Housing

Applying for on-campus housing and a dining plan is a process separate from applying to the University of Maine. You will be sent information from Housing Services. This information provides instructions for the online housing application, a logon ID and password along with information on housing and dining options. You will also learn when you can expect to receive your housing assignment and roommate contact information. You will be assigned based on the date your application is received. We suggest that students requesting to live on campus submit their completed housing application before May 31st. Receive Financial Aid

To be considered for financial aid, you must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA form must be received by the federal processing center prior to March 1 in order to receive full consideration. Failure to meet this deadline will seriously affect your financial aid. Financial aid award letters are mailed after required documents are received for spring enrollment, and beginning in April for fall enrollment. Take Math Placement Test

Go to <https://webct.umaine.edu> and click the "Log In" button to log into WebCT. Enter your UMS User ID and password. The Math Placement Test is under "Course List" in the center of the page. Click the link to start the exam. Please note that it may take up to 24 hours after activating your MaineStreet account for the Math Placement Test to be available in WebCT. If the link to the test does not appear, please wait 24 hours. For assistance, please call the IT Help Desk at 207/581-2506.

Submit Immunization Records

Maine Law requires all full-time and part-time, degree-seeking students born after 1956 to provide proof of immunization against TD (tetanus/ diphtheria) within the last 10 years and two doses of MMR (measles, mumps, rubella) after their first birthday. If measles immunization was done prior to 1968, they must provide proof it was done with a live virus. **Compliance is mandatory. Registration cannot be completed until proof of immunization has been verified by Student Records.** Send a photocopy of the record signed by a doctor or nurse with specific evidence of dosage, type of vaccine and/or immunity to Immunization Records, Shared Processing Center, PO Box 412, Bangor, ME 04402-0412. A high school immunization record is acceptable without a doctor's or nurse's signature, but requires the signature of a school official. You can submit these records at Student Orientation.

Request Final Transcripts

UMaine must receive final transcripts showing completion of current academic work (including date of graduation for high school students). Transfer credit evaluations are initiated in the Office of Student Records from all official transcripts received to date and will be forwarded to your college or program Dean's Office for final evaluation and approval.

Obtain your University ID

Student identification, MaineCard, is required for all UMaine students. Your MaineCard is your access to:

- students' events
- your residence hall and laundry facilities
- dining meal plans
- Black Bear Bucks debit account
- Fogler Library
- and many other campus activities

After you have confirmed your plans to attend, you can visit the Student Service Center in the Memorial Union to get your MaineCard (bring valid State ID or passport for identification). You can also obtain your MaineCard at Student Orientation. MaineCard web site: www.umaine.edu/mainecard/

Purchase Your Parking Permit

All students are allowed to bring a car to campus, however you must purchase a permit to park in university lots. There are several permit options available. Parking Services is located in the Student Service Center of the Memorial Union. You can also obtain your parking permit at Student Orientation. Parking Services web site: www.umaine.edu/parking/

Attend Student Orientation

Register for Classes

Once you have confirmed your enrollment, the Office of Admission will notify your Dean's Office and administrative departments. As a degree student, you will register for courses through the Dean's Office of the college to which you have been accepted. For contact information, see the "Quick Reference Numbers" section on the front page. Students admitted for the fall semester can register for classes at Student Orientation.

Find a Job on Campus

The Office of Student Employment is located on the third floor of the Memorial Union. If you plan to work on campus, proof of eligibility is required (social security card, birth certificate or passport). You will need to bring two of these documents with you when you come to campus.
