Admission Requirements

SAGE participants are generally selected by program staff from among eligible students who have received Tutor Program services, Services for Students with Disabilities, and services from the Onward Program. Referrals to SAGE are also made by staff in other TRiO programs, such as Upward Bound, Veterans Upward Bound, Educational Talent Search and Educational Opportunity Centers. Interested students are welcome to apply directly for services on the SAGE web site.

Program Description

The Student Achievement Grant for Education (SAGE) is a TRiO-Student Support Services project, funded by the U.S. Department of Education. It is designed to assist students from first generation and low-income backgrounds and students with disabilities to be retained at and graduate from the University of Maine.

The program counselors help students enrolled in SAGE through individual and small group counseling to achieve their academic, vocational, and personal goals. Counseling provides students with opportunities to gain information, develop skills, explore values, make decisions, address concerns, and resolve problems and conflicts associated with being a successful college student. Counselors provide a safe, confidential atmosphere for these discussions.

Other services available to SAGE participants include the opportunity to enroll in a second tutor group each semester, join special workshops focusing on financial aid, study skills, and other college success activities, participate in cultural activities, and apply for SAGE scholarships for up to two years, including summer sessions.
