Fall Early Action application deadline - December 15

(Priority for merit scholarships and first consideration for the Honors College is given to early action candidates.)

Fall and Spring Regular Admission - modified rolling admission on a space available basis.
(Fall applicants are encouraged to submit their applications prior to February 1 for full consideration for financial aid.)

FAFSA suggested submission date - February 1
FAFSA deadline date - received by March 1

Office of Admission

Admission Policy

Admission to the University of Maine is selective, based on a combination of academic credentials, scholastic achievement and personal motivation that demonstrate a promise of academic success in the requested programs and space availability.

Early Action

Fall applications complete by December 15 will be reviewed by the end of January. Early action candidates will be given priority for merit scholarships (see below) and consideration for the Honors College.

Regular Admission

Fall applications complete after December 15, Early Action applications referred to the regular application process and spring applications are reviewed, when all required documents have been received, on a modified rolling basis as long as space is available.

Admission Process Checklist for First Year Students

(Transfer students - please refer to the "Transferring to the University" fact sheet)

- Completed Application
- A nonrefundable application fee of \$40 is due with the admission application
- Official high school transcript - first set of senior year grades preferred
- Official SAT I or ACT scores sent directly to the University from the testing agency or included on your official high school transcript
- At least one recommendation letter, preferably from the high school counselor
- Home-schooled students must submit documentation comparable to a high school transcript with a detailed descriptive list of coursework completed. Home-schooled applicants are encouraged to submit results from the General Equivalency Diploma (GED) test as soon as they are available. Those not submitting a GED are required to submit course descriptions and are encouraged to submit results from SAT II subject exams in academic areas relevant to their intended major to help determine if unit/course requirements have been completed.

High School Requirements

Academic requirements vary depending on the college or program of application. Please review the **Academic Requirements for Admission** chart (on page two of this sheet) for the specific unit/course requirements for each academic program.

AP Credit

- Credit is given for most AP test results for scores of 3 or higher.
- Official copies of all AP exam results are required.
- See "Advanced Placement (AP) International Baccalaureate (IB)" fact sheet.

Merit Scholarship Information (Admission scholarships only)

- The Office of Admission manages a significant portion of the merit scholarships awarded to new, first-year students and new, transfer students in addition to scholarships offered by the Office of Student Financial Aid, the University of Maine Foundation, individual academic departments, and individual colleges.
- Information in the completed admission application *at the time of decision* will be used - no additional application is needed for scholarships awarded by the Admissions Office. Scholarships awarded by individual colleges, departments or the University of Maine Foundation may require a separate application
- Early Action candidates will be given first priority for merit scholarships.
- Regular candidates will only be considered on a funds available basis for these awards.

High school level computer sciences and fine arts courses are strongly recommended but not required.
